

that Grandpa went away.




Davie asked Grandma,

about love.”


“When we come here,

“Grandpa wore his body for a very long time. It was a good body, and he enjoyed using it.”


“ But after we use our bodies for many, many years,

as we continue our lessons here on Earth.


He is never far away, Davie,” she said.

as one, two, three .


“ We can

back here to Earth again.




“We will each choose a new body
to help us with all our new lessons here.”





Grandma's words made Davie feel warm all over, for he knew that Grandpa was safe and that they could be together again.















When I Was Big By Debbie Kaplan


